FAQs about CPP 4

What is CPP?

The Church Partnership Program is a DFAT funded program for the seven mainline Churches of PNG which started in 2004. It comes under the PNG–Aus Partnership, a bilateral agreement between the governments of PNG and Australia. The Catholic Church is the first to directly manage CPP, through CPNG.

What kind of programs will CPNG support under CPP 4 and how will it select partners?

CPNG will support CPP Pillar activities under the thematic areas of Advocacy & Research, Disaster Risk Reduction and Community Resilience, Administrative Support for Dioceses, Integral Human Development (IHD) and GEDSI (Gender Equality, Disability and Social Inclusion). There are two ways partners are selected: 'normal consultation' and an 'open call'.

NORMAL CONSULTATION METHOD

ADVOCACY & RESEARCH

Advocacy activities on issues of concern to communities on social justice, peace-building, environmental justice, etc.

DISASTER RISK REDUCTION & COMMUNITY RESILIENCE

CPNG's Disaster Response Operations Manual roll-out and resilience building for communities of high-risk dioceses.

ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT FOR DIOCESES

Targeted support towards upgrading of administrative capacity at the diocese offices in the areas of ICT (Information Communication Technology), Human Resources or Finance.

OPEN CALL

INTEGRAL HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

CPNG's inaugural IHD Program for Church communities partnering with dioceses.

GEDSI

A CPNG program that targets GEDSI Church initiatives or organisations partnering with dioceses.

CPP4 CHURCH PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

OPEN CALL SUMMARY

IHD Program Eligibility (for Communities)



1. Must be a community lacking basic services or in a remote location
2. Must have genuine interest in IHD and be willing to take ownership and responsibility
3. Must have active Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) inclusive of a Caritas representative
4. Must provide a letter of support by the Parish Priest
5. Must have an active Diocesan Caritas Coordinator
6. Must work in collaboration with the respective Diocesan Caritas Office
7. Must not be recipient of current CPNG-funded Project
8. Must be open to providing counter-support

GEDSI Program Eligibility (for Organisations)



1. Must be an organisation or community that provides GEDSI services or programs
2. Must show proof of operation in the last 3-5 Years (provide evidence such as IPA extract, plans, reports, etc.)
3. If community, must provide letter of support by Parish Priest.
4. Must work in collaboration with the respective Diocesan Caritas Office
5. Must not be a recipient of current CPNG-funded Project
6. Must be open to providing counter-support

Application Process

What does the application process involve?

The deadline for applications is September 15th, 2023. Applications will then be shortlisted and submitted to the CBC Central Committee and CPNG Board for review and endorsement in October 2023. Successful applicants will be notified and inducted in November 2023. Following the induction process, partners can start implementation from November onward.



What kind of activities does CPNG support under IHD and GEDSI?

IHD (INTEGRAL HUMAN DEVELOPMENT) PROGRAM:

- ✓ Community-determined small scale projects
- ✓ Community skills training

GEDSI (GENDER EQUALITY, DISABILITY AND SOCIAL INCLUSION) PROGRAM:

- ✓ Specialised GEDSI-based staff training, equipment support and capacity building
- ✓ GEDSI-based community education and awareness programs

What is the maximum funding available for GEDSI and IHD?

IHD PROGRAM

The maximum funding available per community is K150,000

GEDSI PROGRAM

The maximum funding available per organisation is K125,000
